General Rules & Regulations

Please read carefully as the Rules and Regulations will be strictly enforced!

1. Any person or persons who shall interfere with the general rules and while discharging their duties, or shall use contemptuous or abusive language within their hearing, may forfeit any prizes he/she may win.
2. In the absence of competition of one class the judges are instructed to award only such premiums as they think exhibits are deserving of. They will exercise their judgement whether they will award first, second, third or any other prize
3. In the event of shortage of funds, the Abbotsford Agrifair reserves the right to pay prize money on a percentage basis.
4. All animals must be shown in such a way to fully protect the public.
5. Protests affecting awards must be made in writing to the Agriculture Coordinator before 8:00pm on the day of judging, accompanied by \$25.00, which will be forfeited to Abbotsford Agrifair if the protest is not sustained by a majority of designated Committee Members.
6. Abbotsford Agrifair shall not be liable for any loss to any exhibitor occasioned by: fire, accident, condition of structure, or the negligence of any exhibitors or officials or otherwise.
7. No claim of injury to any person or property shall be ever asserted or suit instituted or maintained against Abbotsford Agrifair, its officers or their agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, exhibitor or any person, farm or corporation, or their agents,

representatives, servants or employees, having license of privilege to visit or exhibit on the Abbotsford Agrifair ground or occupying space thereon.

8. All exhibits shall be under the control and director of the officials concerned, but SOLELY AT THE RISK OF EXHIBITORS. All exhibits or stands MUST be removed by the time specified, or otherwise they become the property of Abbotsford Agrifair for disposal. Building will be open the following to the last day of Abbotsford Agrifair upon request. Arrange with security or occupying space thereon.
9. Once awarded, there will be no replacement of ribbons/rosettes lost or damage. If you choose not to keep you ribbon or rosette you may choose you return it to the Ag Coordinator.
10. In the case of space limitations, entries may be accepted on the first come, first served basis.
11. There will be no advertised minimum for classes, however, there is the possibility that classes may need to be combined by the judge or cancelled based on entries. Displays are always welcome. Unless otherwise noted beside class listing.
12. All prize award cheques must be cashed by December 31, 2024.
13. Entry fees, etc. must accompany all entry forms and will be NON-REFUNDABLE. Cheques, money orders, and bank drafts must be made payable to: ABBOTSFORD AGRIFAIR and mailed to: PO Box 2334, Abbotsford, BC V2T 4X2
14. POST-DATED CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
15. A \$50.00 service fee will be applied to all NSF cheques.
16. Move in and move out times must be followed by all exhibitors. If this rule is disregarded, prize money will be forfeited as well as additional penalties incurred at Abbotsford Agrifair's discretion. Special consideration for earlier move out will be given to exhibitor's coming from the Island or exceeding 300km.
17. Refunds: only with doctors or veterinary's certificate turned into the fair office prior to the start of Abbotsford Agrifair.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

ALL ENTRY FEES WILL BE ALLOCATED TO THE PRIZE MONEY PURSE. (GST NOT APPLICABLE)

1. All entries must be made on the official entry forms provided, including all information, fees and signature of exhibitor. See deadlines on page 7.
2. ERRONEOUS ENTRIES: Animals that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper class on application to the Division Chairperson. Any such change must be made prior to the start of breed judging.
3. LATE ENTRIES: See deadlines on page 7. If you have any questions, contact the Ag Coordinator agriculture@agrifair.ca .

4. REFUSING ENTRIES: Agrifair reserves the right to refuse any entry and return any entry fee without being liable for compensation.
5. Exhibitors of livestock must keep the space at rear of their stalls clear and clean. During the day, manure must be taken immediately to the containers provided or buried under the bedding.
6. No tacking up horses in the alleyway.
7. Exhibitors must wear the number allotted to them when showing in the livestock show ring.
8. No animal may be shown in more than one class of single animals except for championship or special classes. – 4-H
9. Agrifair will supply all shavings. STRAW IS PROHIBITED.
10. Any inappropriate behaviour, as deemed by Abbotsford Agrifair, demonstrated by any livestock showman will result in removal of person(s) involved and respective entries, at the persons' expense and the forfeit of all prize money and entry fees.
11. Only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in the group classes.
12. Where tattooing is requirement of registration, the animals must be identifiable with legal tattoo markings, made prior to Abbotsford Agrifair and prior to date of registration.
13. No raw milk may be sold on premises.
14. Cattle on the show circuit carry health status achieved for entry to first exhibition provided they are not returned to premises of lesser health status between shows.
15. There will be no movement of animals by foot throughout the fairgrounds. Animals are to be kept in the ag area, barns, stalls, and arena.
16. Since there will not be any on-farm inspections by federal veterinarians, livestock health problems will be handled by Abbotsford Agrifair and its officials.

**ALL LIVESTOCK MAY BE INSPECTED FOR DISEASE AND OTHER HARMFUL
CONTAGIOUS CONDITIONS. THE INSPECTION WOULD BE BY AGRIFAIR'S
VETERINARIAN (WITH THE BREED REPRESENTATIVE).**

The Livestock Committee, upon recommendation from the veterinarian on duty, has authority to disqualify an infected animal, and demand the immediate removal of such from the Abbotsford Agrifair grounds. This also applies to unsightly ringworms or warts. In the event of a dispute, any veterinary expenses incurred shall be at the expense of the party in error.

- a. Tuberculosis: tests are not required for cattle originating from:
 - a. Accredited herd
 - b. Herds from accredited areas in good standing

- b. Brucellosis: cattle from brucellosis-free regions may enter without a blood test. British Columbia is currently a brucellosis-region. Exhibitors from outside the province should consult their local district Health of Animals veterinarian to determine the appropriate qualifying certification. A health certificate must accompany cattle from out-of-province.
17. TAMPERING WITH LIVESTOCK: Unethical fitting of livestock entered for competition if prohibited. Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure or natural conformation of any part of the animal's body, such as:
- a. The addition of hair or hair substitute, except for artificial switches
 - b. The injection of gas, air, liquid, or other substances subcutaneously in any part of the body.
 - c. Surgical operation to correct defects or the performance of any act of operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of the animal. The cutting, tearing, or gluing of the hide or under the hide to alter the natural conformation.
 - d. Artificial colouring of hair if prohibited.
 - e. Any attempt to disrupt or change the dental development of an animal.
 - f. Any products, solutions, and/or liquids, administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal. This includes the use of steroids, growth promotants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes and any other method by esophagus.

IN THE CASE OF ANY TAMPERING WITH THE LIVESTOCK AS MENTIONED ABOVE, THE EXHIBITOR WILL FORFEIT THE RIGHT TO SHOE THE ANIMAL, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER ANIMALS HE/SHE HAS ENTERED IN THE BREED. ALL DECISIONS MADE BY THE DESIGNATED MEMBERS OF THE LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE ARE FINAL. THE EXHIBITOR WILL ALSO FORFEIT ANY AWARDS FORTHCOMING.

Please check with district veterinarian in plenty of time to ensure you have the proper papers in place.

- 18. FIRE PRECAUTIONS: As necessary precaution against fire and in compliance with City of Abbotsford ordinances, exhibitors shall not use coal oil stove, heating or cooking equipment or fire of any kind in any of the Abbotsford Agrifair buildings.
- 19. Management reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules, to correct any error, or make any necessary alterations in the prize book or forms.
- 20. Sunday controlled move out will commence at 5:30pm. All livestock exhibits must be out of the barn before 12:00pm on Monday August 5th.
- 21. No parking is allowed within fair fencing, parking passes are available on your entry form for the lot you are assigned to.

RIBBONS: We will be giving ribbons out to all jr. members. If the office has a few more, they will be handed out to intermediate and senior members as well.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING 4-H COMPETITIONS

1. Classes are open to boys and girls from invited clubs properly enrolled in the current 4-H program. The age restrictions are 9-19 as of December 31, 2023.
2. Entries must be made on "4-H Entry Form".
3. Where applicable, all 4-H project Rules and Regulations apply to this division.
4. Members must exhibit their own 4-H projects.
5. All entries will be checked for proper identification against those records filed in the 4-H specialists office. Improperly identified or substituted animals will be disallowed.
6. There will be no advertised minimum for classes, however, there is the possibility that classes may need to be combined by the judge or cancelled based on entries. Displays are always welcome. Unless otherwise noted beside class listing.
7. Agrifair will supply all shavings. STRAW IS PROHIBITED.
8. Judging will be by the Danish System for livestock projects and showmanship. Interclub and herdsmanship shall be straight-line placings from first to last of prizes offered.
9. There must be at least two clubs competing in Interclub competitions.
10. Each exhibitor can only show current year projects.
11. Any clipping or grooming of a 4-H animal at Agrifair must be done by the 4-H member.
12. No exhibitors are allowed to sleep in the barn but are allowed to sleep in campers (in designated parking) only if adult supervision is provided.
13. Judging: All 4-H classes listed in the Agrifair prize book will be placed in the Danish system unless otherwise indicated. Members must exhibit their own 4-H project animals in showmanship classes, and members must show in showmanship for the project to be shown in their project class. Any clipping or grooming of 4-H project animals must be done by 4-H members competing with a project at Agrifair, or that project and member may be disqualified from competing.
14. All exhibits must be moved in and set up before 10am Friday August 2nd, 2024.

15. Tear down: Barns will be closed to the public daily at 8:00pm and on Sunday at 5:00pm in time for the 5:30pm controlled move out.
16. Loading of trucks and trailers is NOT PERMITTED on the fairgrounds until release time of such projects. The fair office will assign load out time. Starting at 5:30pm Sunday August 4th.
17. Move out: special consideration given to clubs or exhibitors coming from the Island or exceeding 300km away. Please email office.
18. Members must show their projects in the showmanship class to show in project classes.
19. Show committee and Agrifair officials have the right to deem any club member and/or leader unfit to be involved in shows based on their attitude, actions, or overall conduct.
- 20. There will be no tolerance for animal movement through the tunnel during the fair and especially not during move-in or move-out.**
21. Any members under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be removed from the show and forfeit showing privileges and any prizes or prize money won.
22. All 4-H members/clubs are required to be on display all weekend while barns are open. Due to space concerns in the barn, we have added in some project sections of the Prizebook a certain day that project will be on display and showing. However, if you or your club wants to be on display all weekend you are welcome to it, please contact ag coordinator. agriculture@agrifair.ca

1. Applicants must be at least 17 years old as of January 1st, 2024.
2. Applicants must be a member of 4-H who plans to enter post-secondary education the following fall-semester.
3. Applicants must be showing at Agrifair 2024. If unforeseen circumstances come up, please email agriculture@agrifair.ca
4. Scholarship may not be won 2 years in a row; however, unsuccessful applicants may re-apply the following year.
5. Scholarship winner must claim the scholarship before December 31, 2024.
6. Proof of entry to university or school of applicant's choice must be forwarded to Agrifair before the scholarship will be paid.
7. The scholarship committee will be appointed by Agrifair and reserves the right to withhold awarding scholarship if, in the opinion of the scholarship committee, there is no qualified applicant.
8. The decision of the scholarship committee is final and cannot be appealed.
9. The scholarship winner will be announced during the 4-H Closing Ceremonies during Agrifair 2024. ALL APPLICANTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND THIS EVENT
10. Applicants are required to submit a reference letter for the 2024 scholarship.

Stall Competition aka Herdsmanship Competition

The competition will run from Friday August 2nd at 1pm to Sunday August 4th at 4pm. During this time anonymous judges will be making their rounds through the 4-H barn to judge clubs on the criteria below. Prizes will be awarded at the 4-H closing ceremonies.

*Amounts may vary depending on number of clubs entered. More specific divisions may be made depending on entries.

1. Identification / Presentation - 20 Points

Each club should be identifiable with appropriate signage including information about the club and each member's projects. Signage should be on view for the entirety that the club is exhibiting at the fair. Clubs should present decorations based on our theme. **"I love this fair!"**

2. Agriculture Awareness – 30 points

Exhibitors should display or have additional information available for the public about agriculture and the breeds featured for that club. Examples: posters, handouts, stickers, pictures.

3. Exhibitors – 10 points

Exhibitors (4-H members) should be courteous and polite to the public that may approach their stall.

4. Stall – 20 points

Adequate bedding, tidiness of tack boxes, feed and other equipment and cleanliness is expected. Shoveling manure often!

5. Equipment, feed, and supplies – 10 points

Equipment and supplies should be kept neat and tidy. Contents and conditions of tack boxes will not be considered. Feed is not left out and hay and stacked accordingly. Example: blower cords should be coiled, brooms tucked away.

6. Alleyways – 10 points

Should be kept clear of obstacles and swept for public to easily pass by.
