GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

Please read carefully as Rules and Regulations will be strictly enforced!

1. Any person or persons who shall interfere with the judges while discharging their duties, or shall use contemptuous or abusive language within their hearing, may forfeit any prize he/she may win.
2. In the absence of competition in one class the judges are instructed to award only such premiums as they think exhibits are deserving of. They will exercise their judgment whether they will award first, second, third or any other prize.
3. In the event of shortage of funds, the Abbotsford Agrifair reserves the right to pay prize money on a percentage basis.
4. All animals must be shown in such a way to fully protect the public.
5. Protests affecting awards must be made in writing to the Agricultural Coordinator before 8:00pm on the day of judging, accompanied by \$25.00, which will be forfeited to Abbotsford Agrifair if the protest is not sustained by a majority of designated Committee members.
6. Abbotsford Agrifair shall not be liable for any loss to any exhibitor occasioned by: fire, accident, condition of structure, or the negligence of any exhibitors or officials or otherwise.
7. No claim of injury to any person or property shall be ever asserted or suit instituted or maintained against Abbotsford Agrifair, its officers or their agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, exhibitor or any person, farm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants, or employees, having license of privilege to visit or exhibit on the Abbotsford Agrifair grounds or occupying space thereon.
8. All exhibits shall be under the control and direction of the officials concerned, but SOLELY AT THE RISK OF THE EXHIBITORS. All exhibits or stands MUST be removed by the time specified, or otherwise they become the property of Abbotsford Agrifair for disposal. Building will be open the morning following the close of Abbotsford Agrifair upon request. Arrange with security personnel or the Abbotsford Agrifair office.
9. Once awarded, there will be no replacement of ribbons/rosettes lost or damaged.
10. In the case of space limitations, entries may be accepted on the first come, first served basis.
11. Classes with less than four exhibits per class may be combined by the judge or cancelled based on entries.

12. All prize award cheques must be cashed by December 31, 2023.
13. Entry fees, etc. must accompany all entry forms and will be non-refundable. Cheques, money orders and bank drafts must be made payable to: ABBOTSFORD AGRIFAIR and mailed to:

14. POST-DATED CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
15. A \$50.00 service fee will be applied to all NSF cheques.
16. Move in and move out times must be followed by all exhibitors. If this rule is disregarded, prize money will be forfeited as well as additional penalties incurred at Abbotsford Agrifair's discretion.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

ALL ENTRY FEES WILL BE ALLOCATED TO THE PRIZE MONEY PURSE. (GST NOT APPLICABLE)

1. Entries must be made on the official entry forms with all information, fees, and signature of exhibitor on or before **Monday July 3rd, 2023.**
2. ERRONEOUS ENTRIES: Animals that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper class on application to the Division Chairperson. Any such change must be made prior to the start of breed judging.
3. LATE ENTRIES: Entries received after July 3rd, 2023 but before July 22, 2023 will be accepted with a **\$10** late fee. **NO entries will be accepted after July 22, 2023.** If any questions Contact Ag Coordinator agriculture@agrifair.ca
4. REFUSING ENTRIES: AGRIFAIR reserves the right to refuse any entry and return any entry fee without being liable for compensation.
5. Exhibitors of livestock must keep the space at rear of their stalls clear and clean. During the day, manure must be taken immediately to the containers provided or buried under the bedding.
6. Exhibitors must wear the number allotted to them when showing in the livestock show ring.
7. No animal may be shown in more than one class of single animals except for championship or special classes.
8. Any inappropriate behavior, as deemed by Abbotsford Agrifair, demonstrated by any livestock showperson will result in removal of person(s) involved and respective entries, at the persons' expense and the forfeit of all prize money and entry fees.

GROUP CLASSES

9. Only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in the group classes.

OWNERSHIP

10. Where tattooing is a requirement of registration, the animals must be identifiable with legal tattoo markings, made prior to Abbotsford Agrifair and prior to date of registration.

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

11. No raw milk may be sold on premises.
12. Cattle on the show circuit carry health status achieved for entry to first exhibition provided they are not returned to premises of lesser health status between shows.
13. Since there will not be any on-farm inspections by federal veterinarians, livestock health problems will be handled by Abbotsford Agrifair and its officials.

ALL LIVESTOCK MAY BE INSPECTED FOR DISEASE AND OTHER HARMFUL CONTAGIOUS CONDITIONS. THE INSPECTION WOULD BE BY AGRIFAIR'S VETERINARIAN (WITH THE BREED REPRESENTATIVE).

The Livestock Committee, upon recommendation from the Veterinarian on duty, has authority to disqualify any infected animal, and demand the immediate removal of such from the Abbotsford Agrifair grounds. This also applies to unsightly ringworms or warts. In the event of a dispute, any veterinary expenses incurred shall be at the expense of the party in error.

- a. Tuberculosis: Tests are not required for cattle originating from:
 - i. Accredited herds
 - ii. Herds from accredited areas in good standing
- b. Brucellosis: Cattle from brucellosis-free regions may enter without a blood test. British Columbia is currently a brucellosis-free region. Exhibitors from outside the province should consult their local district Health of Animals veterinarian to determine the appropriate qualifying certification. A health certificate must accompany cattle from out-of-province.

14. TAMPERING WITH LIVESTOCK: Unethical fitting of livestock entered for competition is prohibited. Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body, such as:
- a. The addition of hair or hair substitute, with the exception of artificial switches.
 - b. The injection of gas, air, liquid or other substances subcutaneously in any part of the body.
 - c. Surgical operation to correct defects or the performance of any act of operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of the animal. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or under the hide to alter the natural conformation.
 - d. Artificial colouring of hair is prohibited.
 - e. Any attempt to disrupt or change the dental development of the animal.
 - f. Any products, solutions, and/or liquids, administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal. This includes the use of steroids, growth promotants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping; drench tubes and any other method by esophagus.

IN THE CASE OF ANY TAMPERING WITH THE LIVESTOCK AS MENTIONED ABOVE, THE EXHIBITOR WILL FORFEIT THE RIGHT TO SHOW THE ANIMAL, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER ANIMALS HE/SHE HAS ENTERED IN THE BREED. ALL DECISIONS MADE BY THE DESIGNATED MEMBERS OF THE LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE ARE FINAL. THE EXHIBITOR WILL ALSO FORFEIT ANY AWARDS FORTHCOMING.

Please check with district veterinarian in plenty of time to ensure you have the proper papers in place.

*RANCH DIVISION: The purpose of the Ranch Division is to demonstrate that the Horse is a pleasure to ride as a means of conveyance from one ranch task to another. This division includes four new, exciting classes to show in: Ranch Rail Pleasure (rail work only), Ranch Riding (pattern work only), Ranch Trail (trail pattern only), and Ranchmanship (pattern work only). These classes are to be judged on the horse's performance of the given tasks in the pattern or rail class. The horse should go with a natural headset that is comfortable for that individual. Also, the attire for the class is working tack with traditional western attire, such as jeans and a button-down shirt. Silver show tack and sparkling show jackets should not be worn in these classes, as that would not be worn in real-life ranch work. These classes are a great new opportunity for many horses, because the performance of the gaits and pattern elements in a quiet and pleasurable manner are more important than other show ring attributes.

*COMMAND CLASS: The command class is neither a race nor is it a gymkhana event. It is a competition which exhibits a well-trained, responsive performance horse/pony. Riders must be dressed in suitable Western attire. Entries are eliminated, one at a time at the discretion of the judge as commands are not executed correctly. At no time are ring stewards allowed to partake in the judging or placings of the class. The command to stop from the lope or hand gallop can be given only once in each direction. At no time is the horse/pony to be judged individually or one at a time to decide the class.

*COMBINATION CLASS: To be judged as Western Pleasure first. Then change to English equipment. To be judged as English Pleasure, Five minutes allowed for change over. Must change boots. Same rider will be allowed one groom, suitably attired. Must remain in line until 5-minute whistle. No wheelbarrows allowed.

FLAG RACE: The correct pattern shall be to run across the timing line to the first barrel, passing either to the right or left of it, picking up the flag stick, run to the second barrel, turning around it either to the left or right, then sprint to the timing line, returning the flag stick to the open ended barrel while passing. The competitor may follow a figure 8 pattern, or not. Failure to follow the course, knocking over a barrel, or failing to return the flag to the open barrel, shall cause a contestant to be eliminated.

STAKE RACE: The correct pattern shall be run across the center timing line, turning left or right around the stake at the end, return through the center, turn the opposite way around the other stake, then sprint back through the center, shutting off the time. Failure to follow course or knocking down a stake or course marker shall cause a contestant to be eliminated.

DOUGHNUT RACE: Riders race to the end of the arena, dismount and eat a Tim bit (must whistle to prove eaten) remount horse and race back across finish line.

6. Interclub entries are limited to one per exhibiting club.
7. Agrifair will supply all shavings. STRAW IS PROHIBITED.
8. Judging will be by the Danish System for livestock Projects and Showmanship. Interclub and Herdsmanship shall be straight-line placings from first to last of prizes offered.
9. There must be at least two clubs competing in Interclub competitions
10. Each exhibitor can only show current year projects.
11. No exhibitors are allowed to sleep in the barn but are allowed to sleep in campers (in designated parking) only if adult supervision is provided.
12. Judging: All 4-H classes listed in the Agrifair prize book will be placed on the Danish system unless otherwise indicated. Members must exhibit their own 4-H project animals in showmanship classes, and members must show in showmanship in order for the project to be shown in their project class. Any clipping or grooming of 4-H project animals must be **done by 4-H members competing with a project at Agrifair**, or that project and member may be disqualified from competing.
13. Loading of trucks is NOT PERMITTED on the fairgrounds until release time of such projects. The Entry Office will assign load out time. Starting at 5:30 pm on Sunday Aug 6th
